Robots may reduce employment and wages according to modelling by Daron Acemoglu of MIT. McKinsey's analysis indicates that more jobs will be disrupted than destroyed – six of 10 current occupations could have more than 30% of activities automated. That would mean that many will have to learn new skills and adapt their approach. Looking across the OCEAN model of Personality – what are the implications in the age of robots?

**Open-mindedness** – keep flexible in your view of what could happen, and the opportunities that presents

**Conscientious** – set goals, and work hard on new skills

**Extraversion** – Keep connecting with others and learning what is happening, and where it is happening

**Agreeableness** – ensure your personability provides you with an edge

**Nervousness** – fit in time to manage your emotions and distract yourself from rumination
